The *have + object + past participle* construction

(answers)

Use the correct form of **have**. Use **am/is/are having** as a future form, (**get** can be used instead of **have**, but is more colloquial.)

1. I *am having* my house painted. That is why there is all this mess.
2. My hair looks dreadful; I think I *will have* it set tomorrow.
3. The attic was dark so last year we *had* skylight put in.
4. That dead tree is dangerous. I *am having* it cut down tomorrow.
5. We *have* just *had* central heating installed. The house is warm!
6. I can't read Greek so I *am having* the documents translated. My nephew is helping with the translation.
7. *Did you have* the film developed or did you develop it yourself?
8. Why *does* he *have* all his shoes specially made?
He says that he has to because his feet are different sizes.
9. *Do you have* your milk delivered or do you go to the shop for it?
10. If you hate cleaning fish why *don't* you *have* them cleaned at the fishmonger's? (*negative*)
