One of Britain's most eminent scientists says the coronavirus crisis has "exposed that the country wasn't as well-prepared as it should have been". Sir Paul Nurse was speaking as his leading research center began helping to carry out coronavirus tests. In an interview with the BBC, Sir Paul added that it wasn't the time to go into detail and it was important right now to work together to get through it. Here's our health editor Hugh Pym.
