US vs UK English

The English language was introduced to the Americas by British colonization, from the late 16th and early 17th centuries. Similarly, the language spread to numerous other parts of the world as a result of British trade and colonisation and the spread of the British Empire, which, by 1921, ruled over a population of 470–570 million people, about a quarter of the world's population at that time.

Over the past 400 years, the form of the language used in the Americas—especially in the United States—and that used in the United Kingdom have diverged in a few minor ways, leading to the versions now sometimes referred to as American English and British English. Differences between the two include pronunciation, grammar, vocabulary, spelling, punctuation, idioms, and the formatting of dates and numbers. This can be important when writing scientific English, as US journals often expect only US spelling.

Here is a list of the most common words in both forms of English so that you can begin to get an idea of spelling.
